1. Call to Order: 6:01 pm
2. Introductions: Went around the room and introduced ourselves
3. Approval of Agenda

5. Reports

a. Teacher Reports

- i. Music: preparing for the winter concert for grades 1 and 2 (Dec 18th), Grade 1-5 has been learning the story of the Wizard of Oz and will have the opportunity to see it live
- ii. Gym: Grade 3-5 are working on their volleyball skills, including learning the game Newcomb Ball. K-2 is learning modified skills with balloons, beach balls and foam balls
- iii. EES: are focused on practicing social interactions (sharing, taking turns in small groups), they are forming new friendships
- iv. Grade 5: Learning place value, number systems and operations using 'Exploding Dots' learning to work with larger numbers (up to 10-millions)
- v. Grade 4: Are learning about the first explorers that came to Canada. Some students used Canva to create info graphics to display their learning. They also used loose parts to create some of the first settlements in New France. They took pictures of their buildings and told stories
- vi. Grade 3: Took a frilled trip to the Sam Center, during pre-learning at the school they had the opportunity to learn about the history of the pancake breakfast and got to taste pancakes. During the field trip they answered the question "who are Albertans?"

- vii. Grade 2: Were focused on Remembrance Day in November through story reading and building with loose parts to demonstrate how peace feels to them and coupled it with writing activities.
- viii. Grade 1: Are building a writer's workshop routine and are working on the three ways to write a story using pictures, letters and words. They learned that writers write about what they know and love. They are learning about 'all-star' work and expected criteria in their work. In math they are working on sorting and patterns in our world. They are learning to identify working rules and create extended patterns with a core of up to 4 parts (with support from their grade 5 buddies)
- ix. Kindergarten: are working on building foundational skills such as learning their letter shapes and sounds, proper letter formation and learning to write their names. In math they are learning numbers 1-10 through counting, writing and creating math pictures. They are also working on their social skills such as getting along with others and sharing

- ii. November Updates
 - 1. Fall RAM
 - a. Loss of international student allocations
 - i. IDT (identify for transfer) 15-hour EA, 2 EAs at 25 hours, 1 EA at 20 hours
 - b. Restructured Grade 1 due to numbers and complexity (from 3 to 4 classes; brought Mrs. McLarty into the team. 4 classes of 20 now)
 - c. Mrs. White is supporting grades 2 and 3, allowing both grades to break out into 4 groups for math and literacy (grade 2 classes; 27, 27 and 28, Grade 3 classes; 27, 28, and 28)
 - d. CBRF Request in to increase our 3 EAs to 30 hours each and hire an additional 30-hour EA

 - a. Teachers will share what they know about your child's strengths and next steps and provide an opportunity to ask any questions you may have

- a. A way to be strategic in the absence of a lot of human resources; teachers do assessments and then group students based on targeted skills. Students are grouped in the most advantageous way for delivering instruction to meet their individual needs.
